



Lexington Moose Lodge 2511 Hosts 7th Annual Child ID Event

MANSFIELD, OH- The Annual Child Safety Identification Program at the Richland Mall saw over 100 children on Saturday.

Scott Gossett of the Ohio State Moose Association said that the event gives parents the opportunity to get a child ID to use in case of an emergency.

"We set up and we work with the local law enforcement agencies. We get information from parents and we fingerprint and photograph kids," Gossett said. "We give the CDs to the parents we keep no information these kids."

Having the Child ID disc will help law enforcement in case of an emergency where the child goes missing.

"If anything ever happens to the child, the child gets lost, runs away, abducted, all they have to do is call any local law enforcement agency in the United States and they'll take that CD, put it in their car computer and it saves valuable time looking for the child," Gossett said.

The annual event is one of the Lodge's largest Child ID events of the year according to Gossett.

"We are right now at 108 children done today in just a matter of three and a half hours which is really good," Gossett said. "This is our biggest event we do every year and this is our seventh year here at the mall and it keeps getting bigger."
